Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

We have now entered the season of Pentecost in the church year. It is otherwise known as the long green season, where the paraments are green for what seems like forever. The Pentecost season is kicked-off by the Day of Pentecost. The Day of Pentecost is the day when Christians around the world celebrate the Holy Spirit – the gift of God's comfort, power, and strength given to God's people.

Pentecost derives its name from the Jewish festival, Festival of Weeks, celebrating the harvest and the giving of the law on Mount Sinai fifty days after Passover. For this reason, the Greek-speaking Jews of the first century called the festival Pentecost from the Greek word meaning "fiftieth day." Fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the Holy Spirit as God's presence within and among us.

You might have heard the Day of Pentecost being referred to as the birthday of the church, marking the day that Jesus' disciples began to share the story of Jesus and invite others to share in their faith in Jesus as the Son of God. The book of Acts tells us the story about how the disciples' lives got turned upside down which led to the world being turned upside down, too. On the Day of Pentecost, we invite the same Spirit that filled the disciples that day to transform our lives.

Our lectionary includes lots of stories about discipleship during the Pentecost season. Jesus calls and sends the disciples to share good news of the coming reign of God, including us. The sending is an ongoing act that requires us to be creative, take risks, evaluate, and try again. There will be failure. There will be success. There will be costs. No matter what, the Spirit will be at work in our lives and God's presence will be known among us.

As we travel for family gatherings and take our summer trips in these next months, may we always remember to pray for each other. And, pray for the Spirit to be at work among all of us to share the Truth of God's Word and invite others to Holy Trinity Lutheran Church on the corner of Cook Road and Lexington Avenue. I look forward to seeing you in worship.


Holy Trinity participated in the National Day of Prayer Service held on May 4, 2023, along with several other local churches.
