


# To Be and To Make Disciples of Jesus Christ

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I've been spending a lot of time in my yard in recent weeks. When I am not throwing the ball for Barclay to catch, I am walking across the lawn in search of holes to fill in with topsoil and then cover with grass seed. Unfortunately for me, my yard has lots of holes caused by water drainage and the removal of some trees and root systems over the years. I'll be at it a little at a time over the next few years, I am sure.

As I was spreading seed one evening, I was reminded of the Parable of the Sower (Matthew 13:1-9) which is in our lectionary this month. Take a minute to read this parable before reading further.

Did you notice the generosity of the sower? Rather than carefully planting seeds in well-plowed ground, the sower throws it everywhere – in the rocks, on the path, into the weeds. An ancient sower would not have planted seed that way because seed was a precious commodity back then. It had to be carefully gleaned. The point that Jesus is making is that this sower sows liberally. There is plenty of seed to spare and he simply trusts some of the seed he sows will find receptive soil.

That has implications for us as a people called to make disciples. Just as this sower was generous in sowing the seed, we are called to be generous in sharing the seed of God's Word. Those seeds might be a verbal explanation of the Good News about Jesus or a passage of Scripture, but those are not the only seeds we have been called to cast. Sometimes we cast seeds of prayer, seeds of patient and compassionate listening, seeds of hope and encouragement, and seeds of simple acts of kindness.

In addition to the generosity of the sower, notice in the parable how the soil is not perfect, but the seed is. The sower cast the same seed all over the field, but some of the soil was not receptive. It was not that the seed was ineffective, it is that not all soil is ready for the seed. Think about what that means.

When it comes to casting seed, it is our job to cast – in word and deed – but the "success" is in God's hands. The sower casts seed, but God makes it grow. We do not have to worry about "success." We don't have to worry about whether we know enough, have the right words to say, or will offend someone. God promises that his word never returns to him empty. Even though most seed will not immediately sprout, those seeds that do sprout will bear an abundant harvest.

The brokenness of the world has a way of breaking open people's hearts and minds, making them more receptive soil for a word of encouragement and hope. Consider where you might have the opportunity to cast the seed of God's Word. Maybe it is with a friend or neighbor or a family member. Into what soil might God be calling you to cast that seed? Pray about it. Pray that the seed you cast will find receptive soil.

### **Highlights of Pastor's Report for Council**

- Attending Lutheran Week/NALC Convocation in Oklahoma City August 7th through 12th.
- Using vacation time August 13th—August 20th.
- NALC North Central Ohio Mission District hosting an event on Saturday, September 30th for congregations to gather and build flood buckets for NALC Disaster Response.

### **The Holy Trinity Story**

The date was July 22, 1948. It was raining. Lightning flashed. The meeting place was the then temporary parsonage of a mission developer, Pastor Wray C. Smith at 608 Westview Boulevard. Eight people met with the purpose of laying the groundwork for establishing Holy Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church of Mansfield.

The completion and dedication of our First House of Worship (now our chapel) was February 18, 1951. The Xander Hall Education Unit was completed in March of 1955. In April of 1965 the third and largest of the three-unit complex was dedicated. Led by the tireless efforts of Reverend Wray Smith, the congregation grew to the enrollment at that time of 898.

A committee of current members has been meeting to plan ways to celebrate this our seventy-fifth year. Descendants of original members are our honorary chairs. These include Chuck Robinson, Becky (Broeske) McKinley, Carol Myers, and Reverend Wray's son, Mark Smith. Currently Pastor Kathy is videotaping interviews with them. Other long-time members will also be asked to participate.

The culmination of this event will take place each Sunday in October. John Burgess, Amy Little, Pastor Pentti Maki and Pastor Dick Beal will aid in the services. Pastor Paul Oman, an artist, has been contracted to paint an artwork to commemorate our 75<sup>th</sup>.

The committee hopes all members will join them for the events planned. We would also appreciate your ideas and memories. Contact Pastor Kathy, Bonnie Elias, or Carol Bertholf with questions, memories, and information.

### Looking back on the Last 25 Years at HTLC

This is a new monthly column presenting information in preparation for celebrating HTLC's 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. Dave Erwin researched our archival council minutes for these intriguing facts.

### 1999:

Pastor Lambert asked for forgiveness for leading the congregation with an emphasis on US rather than God. He stated that the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary gave us another chance to grow, thrive, and change. He promised the church council that they would not be bored with his reports for the next 24 months. He presented vision statements from <u>Growing Spiritual Redwoods</u>.

The 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee planned activities to promote togetherness within the congregation. A focus was placed on the question "Why do you belong to this church?" The Finance Committee urged prayerful consideration of increasing giving. The auction that year raised over \$4000.00.

### **2000**:

The Church Council recommended hiring Amy Little as an intern from August 1, 2000 through July 31st, 2001.

The Technology committee starts a web page.

The Church Council held a retreat in February led by Dave Anderson. The focus was to clarify their values. They discussed current positives and listed opportunities for improvement. Questions included: What if they changed the focus of Council from haring reports to prayer and planning? What if we shrunk Council to give active people leadership in short term projects?

The pastor's evaluation was conducted by the congregation. Offerings were up over what was expected. The budget for 2001 had a deficit of \$14,154.

### 2001:

The Council President asked for more members to sign up for committees.

Pastor Lambert commented that HTLC lost membership over the past year. He wanted to focus on how to achieve our mission. Intern Amy Little helped HTLC become a teaching congregation.

Bob Glessner introduced Ron Zoesch, assistant to the Bishop at May Council meeting. He assisted them in outlining goals for a new mission statement. The new mission statement was adopted in October.

Pastor Lambert declined a pay increase. In December, he suffered a stroke.

Make plans now to attend the special events and celebration of Holy Trinity's 75th Anniversary in October. Watch for announcements in bulletins and upcoming newsletters!


