


To Be and To Make Disciples of Jesus Christ

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Families were decorating for Christmas in my neighborhood as soon as Halloween was over. No recognition of Thanksgiving. They went straight to Christmas. This behavior shows me that people are longing for something better than they are experiencing now. They want joy. But do they know what will bring them true joy? Or will they move right to Valentine's Day on December 26th? This is why we need the Advent season before we celebrate Christmas.

The word Advent means "coming." It is the season of the Church year where we are reminded of the reality of Christ's coming into our world. It is a season of preparation and anticipation, not simply for the celebration of Christmas, but to recognize that hope and expectation are a part of our daily life of faith.

When writing on the subject of Advent, Martin Luther spoke of three different "comings" of Christ: The first coming was indeed when Christ was born as a child in Bethlehem – his coming in the past. The first advent was when the eternal Son of God took on human flesh and became a living part of our world.

As Christians, we also believe in the second coming of Christ – his coming in the future. At the end of all time, Christ will return to bring his kingdom to fulfillment. On that day he will raise us up to appear before his throne of judgment.

The third coming of Christ of which Luther spoke has no single particular time attached to it, so it is perhaps better *cont'd next pg*

to put no number to it at all. This other coming of Christ does not occur with portents in the heavens, no choirs of angels on high. It is an advent that is hard to see at all, because it happens through the Spirit of God. This is Christ's coming into the present, when our Lord enters into the hearts of everyday people in the here and now, through his Word, in faith.

Of the three, this may be the single most important Advent of Christ, at least as far as our salvation is concerned. Because it is only through the advent of faith that the first and second comings of Christ take on meaning for us as individuals. It is when Christ enters our hearts that his presence becomes a reality for each of us in our lives, and we recognize all the many ways that God is truly with us.

We are reminded in Romans 8:24-25 – Hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he sees? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience. May we use the four weeks of the Advent season to prepare our hearts to receive the coming Messiah so that when we celebrate His arrival during the twelve days of Christmas we all may join in saying, "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord."

Your Family and Generosity

How does one become a generous person? Are people born generous? Or is it learned? A Barna Group study of generosity among Christians found two types of people: givers, those who are generous and give freely; and keepers, people who guard and take their time, talents and money for themselves.

For many of us, generosity is a way of life. how we give to God and to others was modeled for us by parents, extended family members and mentors in the faith.

One way to be more reflective about giving is to look at the emotional processes within our own families. Money can easily become a focus for anxiety—a chronic, ongoing preoccupation with survival and security. Research shows that financial hardships produce added anxiety and fear in families and can have negative effects on children and interparental relationships. Who in your family of origin expresses generosity to you? What was the general attitude towards philanthropy and stewardship? How was gift-giving expressed in your family? Was generosity reciprocated, or was it one-sided, leading to animosity? Perhaps giving became strictly a duty and obligation with little joy. How did the faith of your parents play out in your understanding of generosity?

Another area to look at in our families is the overfunctioning of those who take on too much of the responsibility of giving and those who underfunction by not taking on enough responsibility. You see this play out in many congregations—there are people who give more, worry more and spend more time thinking about money than others. If you find yourself staying awake at night about money matters, you are overfunctioning.* Remember the financial stability of every congregation is every member's responsibility, not solely that of the pastors or the leadership.

Pastors often underfunction in the area of generosity and giving. Many don't like to deal with money matters and often feel inadequate when preaching about giving and/or reading financials and spreadsheets. But underfunctioning, like overfunctioning, is a result of anxiety, and both can cause problems that affect stability.

A well-functioning family helps its members develop into financially independent adults—not codependents. Likewise, an effective church leader enables the financial team to develop autonomy and provide meaningful, objective information for clear decision making.

In more than half of Jesus' 38 parables, he addressed money and our relationship with money. You see, we all have a unique money backstory, and our families greatly influence how we relate emotionally and spiritually to giving.

But God wants us to find our true self and understand and be increasingly aware of our weaknesses, strengths, and motivations. God urges us to take a deeper and longer look at how, through the generations, we have been influenced and shaped in our response to money and material things. God calls us to question our giving patterns and our behaviors so we will be set free from the fears, worries and anxieties that keep us away from living a life that is fully free, fully alive and fully dependent on His boundless and inexhaustible love for us!


NOVEMBER OUTREACH MINISTRY


