


To Be and To Make Disciples of Jesus Christ

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

One of the goals our council gave themselves for 2024 was to establish core values by Easter. Council was successful in completing this task. Now, you may wonder why it is necessary for us to have core values if we already have mission and vision statements. Well, core values help us when decisions must be made about what to say yes to and what to stop doing. This becomes especially important when identity is shifting, and resources are dwindling. Core values are a critical component of our congregation's identity because they explain why we do what we do.

They are to describe us when we are operating at our best, naming our best attributes on our best days.

Council met for several hours one Sunday afternoon to take note of themes and traits while we answered questions and shared stories. The questions for consideration were:

- What sets us apart from other congregations?
- What are Holy Trinity's strengths?
- What activities must be tended to, and if they weren't tended to there would be conflict?

For story time, each council member was to respond to one of the following prompts:

- Tell a story about a time when you felt most proud of being part of Holy Trinity. What was happening? Who was involved? What did those positive feelings prompt you to do?
- Reflecting on your entire experience at Holy Trinity, remember a time when you felt the most engaged, alive and motivated.
 Who was involved? What did you do? How did it feel?

We ended the day by noting what is important about our past, and discerning what is the best from our past that we will carry into the future.

Then, during our next council meeting, we reviewed all our notes from that Sunday afternoon to list characteristics that define Holy Trinity Lutheran Church.

The final task for that evening was to narrow the list down to 3 or 4 characteristics. This was the most difficult talk. And at our next council meeting we focused on those 3 or 4 characteristics and worked on wordsmithing our core values. Lastly, once we established core values we then attached Bible verses to them.

The following is what we finalized. I pray you find that these core values fit us, the people of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, well, and can agree that they describe us when we are operating at our best, naming our best attributes on our best days.

Remembering Moms as A Shoulder to Lean On: Support Richland Pregnancy Services







In what has become a tradition at Holy Trinity, the Social Ministry Committee is again asking you to donate to Richland Pregnancy Services on Mother's Day.

A table containing baby bottles will be set up in the narthex on May 5th. Take one home and fill it with a generous donation on Mother's Day. Your pledge will be matched with a donation from the tithing fund.

Richland Pregnancy Services offers medical services such as pregnancy testing, ultrasounds, and STD testing and treatment. They offer parenting classes, mom-to-mom mentoring, a store for purchasing needed supplies, and after abortion support. The fathers are also included with a Dad-to-Dad program. Their service is essential to let those struggling realize that they are not alone. It is an essential service.



When Do I Have Enough? Rev. Dr. Amy Little

It's easy to give thanks to God when everything is going well, when we feel secure, when our bodies are functioning perfectly and nothing hurts. In those times we can praise the Lord for his goodness and mercy.

It's the times when we are struggling that we need help giving thanks—when bills are left unpaid, when our health is a challenge, when our children are in need and we don't have the resources, energy, or patience to deal with everything. St. Paul's words to us in those difficult seasons of life are precious and encouraging.

"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you" (1 Thessalonians 5:15-18).

"Rejoice always!" We are called to be joyful in the good times and in the bad because we have Jesus! We have the promise of new life and God's providential care and comfort. With joyful hearts we can sense God's presence.

"Pray without ceasing!" Never stop offering cares and concerns and joys to the Lord. He wants to hear from Us! Not because he doesn't already know the state of our heart, but because he wants us to *know* that he knows!

Paul says it is God's will in Jesus Christ that we give thanks no matter what's going on around us, in us and through us. This is the way of discipleship! When we give thanks in all circumstances, we come to realize that we have enough. God provides all we need for the day. Tomorrow is another day, and he will provide for that day as well.

First Hot Point: Are you a glass half empty or a glass half full kind of person? It might be a cliché, but there's great truth in it. Do you give thanks for all that you have, or do you spend time lamenting about what you don't have?

Second Hot Point: Paul was consistent with his message to rejoice and pray. To the Philippians, he wrote, "*Rejoice in the Lord always: again I will say, rejoice. Let your CONTD*


reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." (Philippians 4:6-8). At the end of the chapter he concludes: "And my God will supply every need of yours according to his riches in glory in Christ Jesus" (v. 19). If you really look at your life, do you have what you need, or are you lacking? If you're lacking, pray to the Lord to provide for all your needs. If you have all you need for the day, give thanks and marvel at the wondrous gifts of God and how blessed you are.

Third Hot Point: This is an attitude of abundance, rather than an attitude of scarcity. You may not have everything you want, but I'm willing to bet you have all you need from day to day. Perhaps there was a time when you were in need and God provided for you just in time—not too early and definitely not too late! Trust the Lord to give you blessings, as he said: "'Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened" (Matthew 7:7-8).

- * <u>Planned giving</u>- making a significant gift financially as a strategy. Planned or intentional giving can include cash, required minimum distribution from IRAs (if 71-1/2 or older), life insurance, stocks, beneficiary proceeds, etc.

Our Congregation has an established Campership/ Youth program fund that might be able to assist with the cost of attending such a program!




Parish Ed Committee will meet on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>May 7 at 6pm</u>.
